To do so it:

- encourages and supports the growth and development of interfaith initiatives at all levels, from grassroots to national;
- produces practical resources for interfaith engagement and shares good practice;
- works for greater public knowledge and mutual understanding of the teachings, traditions and practices of the different faith communities in Britain;
- provides a forum for national faith community bodies to come together in focused dialogue;
- facilitates engagement between faith communities and Government and public agencies;
- runs a trusted information and advice service;
- leads on national Inter Faith Week; and
- runs special focus programmes highlighting key topics, such as young people's interfaith engagement.
